Resiliency Centre Set Up in Merritt for Flood Victims

For Immediate Release (May 12, 2017): The Thompson-Nicola Regional District, in conjunction with the Lower Nicola Indian Band, is opening a Resiliency Centre in Merritt. The centre will provide information about disaster financial programs and offer clean-up kits to flood-impacted residents of the Regional District.

The TNRD-Lower Nicola Indian Band Resiliency Centre will be set up at the Merritt Civic Centre beginning Saturday, May 13, from 10 a.m. until 2 p.m. The Centre will then be open on Tuesday, Thursday and the following Saturday, with the same hours of operation.

Representatives from the TNRD, the Lower Nicola Indian Band, the Canadian Red Cross, and the Disaster Financial Assistance Program and will be on hand to provide information and offer assistance.
