Resiliency Centre to Close on Saturday

For Immediate Release (July 28, 2017 – 4:00 p.m.): With many evacuees returning home, the TNRD Resiliency Centre at Lansdowne Village will be shut down at 5:00 p.m. on Saturday, July 29, 2017.

In addition, the Reception Centre at Sandman Centre will be scaled down to reflect the current demand. Emergency Social Services and Red Cross will remain on site to assist new and renewing evacuees. Group lodging will also be available as long as required.

As the fires are still active and many addresses remain on Evacuation Alert, the Reception Centre is ready to scale back up if necessary.

The TNRD covers 11 municipalities (Ashcroft, Barriere, Cache Creek, Chase, Clearwater, Clinton, Kamloops, Logan Lake, Lytton, Merritt and Sun Peaks) and 10 Electoral Areas - "A" (Wells Gray Country), "B" (Thompson Headwaters), "E" (Bonaparte Plateau), "I" (Blue Sky Country), "J" (Copper Desert Country), "L", "M", "N", "O" (Lower North Thompson) and "P" (Rivers and the Peaks).
