Loon Lake Damage Assessment July 28 & 29, 2017

At the recent public meeting on Tuesday, July 31, 2017, we advised that the Damage Assessment Team was able to complete an assessment of properties on the road side of Loon Lake. This assessment was completed on July 28 and 29, and reflects any damage as of that time. Unfortunately, conditions did not permit the team to safely go onto the water-access only side of the lake, so no assessments could be made of those properties. The option of going over to those properties to complete an assessment will continue to be monitored.

The system is fairly straightforward to operate. First find the general location of your property by clicking on the screen and dragging it to a specific area. When you are in the general location of your property, zoom in (using the "+" feature) until the symbol attached to your address is clearly visible. Click on the symbol, and pictures with a summary of the assessment information will pop up.

Important Information to Note:

Our second round of assessments were intended to provide information and photographic evidence of buildings relatively undamaged by fire, to provide an overall assessment of damage throughout the Loon Lake community. Assessments were limited to residences located on individual properties. Information on accessory building damage was not captured except in a limited reference capacity and noted on placards placed on principal residences. Recreational vehicle or boat damage information was neither collected nor assessed.

A representative from the Office of the Fire Commissioner attended to determine if imminent hazards, such as fuel tank hazards, continue to exist or require mitigation. A Senior Geotechnical Engineer made a determination of possible slope stability hazard, or imminent danger from fire damaged or otherwise compromised trees. A Building Inspector performed a visual inspection of the external surface of the structure.
