## Disposal Information for Contractors

### 2017 Wildfires

The following solid waste disposal information is designed primarily for contractors performing demolition and clean-up of buildings and property destroyed by wildfire.

**IMPORTANT NOTE:** There is no landfill in the Western TNRD since the Cache Creek landfill was closed in 2016. The TNRD operates transfer stations in Cache Creek, Clinton, and Loon Lake where all waste is reloaded and transferred to a landfill in Kamloops. We will strive to provide the best service possible within the confines of these small facilities while ensuring we are protecting the health and safety of our workers. Please note, burnt buildings and other large demolition/construction loads must be hauled directly to an operating landfill.

**The nearest landfill for disposal is the Mission Flats landfill in Kamloops (operated by the City of Kamloops).** Material from the Pressy Lake properties can go to the South Cariboo landfill in 100 Mile House (operated by the Cariboo Regional District). The TNRD can also accept large loads of burnt material at landfills in Heffley Creek and Lower Nicola.

We understand there will be many unique and challenging disposal issues arising out of this emergency and we will assist you to find solutions wherever possible.

#### **Burnt Buildings & Ash:**

---

Burnt buildings and residual ash may contain hazardous materials such as asbestos and toxic chemicals. Burnt buildings and ash are subject to special disposal regulations to protect health and safety of workers and the public. This material cannot be disposed on at TNRD Transfer Stations, it must be disposed of directly at a landfill. Any materials with known or suspected asbestos, must go to the Mission Flats or Heffley Creek Landfill for special handling. Call the numbers below to make an appointment at least 24 hours in advance. Asbestos containing waste is accepted at Mission Flats Landfill between the hours of 9:00 AM – 10:30 AM and 2:00 PM - 3:30 PM on weekdays.

- Burnt building and ash must be disposed of directly at landfill (not permitted at transfer stations)
- Clean-up contractors are responsible for the safety of their own workers. The TNRD recommends appropriate precautions be taken by contractors to protect their workers.
- A **Waste Generator Declaration Form** must be submitted 24 hours in advanced of planned disposal. Contact TNRD or City of Kamloops depending on the landfill. See list of landfills below.
- Demolition/Construction disposal fees apply - \$160/tonne
- Check with operating authority on what payment methods are accepted at the landfill of disposal.
- Expect delays at landfill – trucks may be held at the scale until staff are prepared and other customers have left the dumping area

- Cover/tarp and wet all loads to protect public and workers

**Disposal Fees:**

---

Disposal fees remain in place. Please refer to [tnrd.ca](http://tnrd.ca), [kamloops.ca](http://kamloops.ca), or call the Cariboo Regional District at 1-800-665-1636 for full list of fees of the site you plan on depositing material at. Disposal fees will be waived for homeowners bringing in debris from wildfire impacted properties with a completed **Tipping Fee Waiver Application**. Contact the TNRD for additional information.

Many TNRD transfer stations do not have weigh scales so volume based fees are used at these locations. All landfills have weigh scales.

**Scrap Metal:**

---

Scrap metal (not including burnt vehicles) can be dropped off free of charge at TNRD transfer stations and landfills.

**Fridges and Freezers:**

---

Fridges and freezers can also be recycled for free for a limited time at TNRD transfer stations only. If it is unsafe to empty the contents from a fridge or freezer follow the steps below.

- Seal the doors shut with duct tape
- Label the appliance “contaminated” in large print
- Transport to TNRD disposal facility
