

The TNRD will waive tipping fees for homeowners who sustained structure loss as a direct result of 2017 wildfires. The fee waiver applies to clean-up of debris from wildfire damaged properties, fridges/freezers containing spoiled food and bagged spoiled food resulting from evacuations.

Already Paid Disposal Fees?

The TNRD will reimburse residents who have already paid disposal fees for debris from wildfire damaged properties. Please complete a **Tipping Fee Rebate Application** form and submit it to the TNRD by mail or by email.

Still Have Wildfire Damage to Clean-up On Your Property?

You must complete a **Tipping Fee Waiver Application** available from the TNRD website or from a TNRD solid waste facility and bring it with you at time of disposal. Contractors cleaning up large amount of material (dump truck loads) please see the Disposal Information for Contractors sheet and be advised site restrictions apply to large loads of material. Contact the TNRD for further information.

Burnt Dwellings – if your home (or other structure) was damaged by fire, be aware that burnt buildings and residual ash may contain hazardous materials such as asbestos and toxic chemicals. Burnt buildings and ash are subject to special disposal regulations to protect health and safety of workers and the public. As a general rule, residual waste from burnt dwellings (building containing drywall, insulation etc.) is not accepted at transfer stations, this material must be disposed of direct to landfill. See exceptions below. Contact the TNRD to discuss disposal options specific to your property.

Ash must be double bagged and securely sealed, bagged ash may be disposed of at transfer stations. Please take care to ensure bags do not break open when dropping into the bins. Loose ash (not double bagged) will not be accepted at transfer stations.

Wood - Small quantities of burnt wood (lumber, plywood, etc.) can be disposed of at the transfer station. A small load is generally considered to be a pick-up truck load or equivalent.

Brush & Branches – Brush and branches (less than 8" diameter) are accepted free of charge at the 70 Mile transfer station, Clinton transfer station, Lower Nicola landfill and Heffley Creek landfill. Brush and branch stockpiles have also been established in Loon Lake and east of Pressy Lake on North Bonaparte Road for disposal of burnt tree debris.

Vinyl Siding - Fire damaged vinyl siding can be disposed of at transfer stations and landfills.

Scrap Metal is accepted free of charge for recycling at transfer stations and landfills.

Vehicles are not accepted at the transfer station or landfills due to space constraints. Contact the TNRD for options to dispose of burnt vehicles.

Concrete is accepted at the transfer stations and landfills.

Small Animals - up to 60kg (130lbs), can be double bagged and disposed of in refuse bins at transfer stations and landfills.

Large Animals - over 60kg (130lbs) can only be disposed of at landfills only. 24 hours advanced notice is required.

2017 Elephant Hill Wildfire Disposal Information for Property Owners

Fridges & Freezers:

If you deem it SAFE to open your fridge/freezer:

- Double bag spoiled food and bring to any TNRD transfer station or landfill free for disposal
- Keep and continue to use your appliance

If you deem it UNSAFE to open your fridge/freezer:

- Seal the doors shut with duct tape
- Label the appliance 'contaminated' in large print
- Drop off at nearest TNRD transfer station or landfill.

Brush and Branch Stockpiles

Loon Lake	4.5 km from the Loon Lake transfer station heading west on Loon Lake Road. See Loon Lake Map for further details.	These sites are for burnt trees, brush and branches only. No construction or demolition material allowed. Please bring to a facility for proper disposal. Tipping fees will be waived with complete paperwork.
Pressy Lake	3.2 km from Young Lake Road turn off heading east on North Bonaparte Road. See Pressy Lake Map for further details.	

Winter hours are in effect from October 1 – March 31
Summer hours are in effect from April 1 – September 30
